Apartment Store, City Worldly wise

Hanspeter Limacher and Marcel Hofmann opened this dishy space in 2004 with the aim of showcasing international brands previously absent from the Swiss market. The emphasis is on classic clothing - with collections from Margaret Howell, Sofie D'Hoore and Officine Generale filling the rails though you can also find eccentric items from brands such as APC. 2 Kevin in the Woods, Langstrasse Get outta here

A welcome addition to the roster of retailers on Europaallee, Kevin in the Woods brings a sense of wanderlust to city slickers. Concrete interiors are paired with practical but polished clothing and accessories.

Combining form and function, the selection is described as "urban outdoor" and is ideal for both a Swiss mountainside and city pavement. Men's and womenswear items are plucked from brands such as Swissbased merino loungewear designer Emyun, leading fabric technology company Snowpeak and French trainers brand Veja.

③ VMC, Rathaus The jean team

This denim mecca in the Altstadt has been dressing savvy Zürcher since 1986. Roger Hatt and his wife have a knack for sourcing a mean mix of vintage and deadstock US jeans, British tweeds and hard-to-find Japanese labels such as Timeworn Clothing.

While the range feels predominantly masculine, the variety and quality of the cuts opens the stock up to both sexes. The heaving shelves also hold more contemporary, high-end threads, pristine leather jackets and cowboy boots. Thema Selection, Rathaus *Utility room*

When Sissi Zoebeli, Ursula Rodel and Katharina Bebié took men's fabrics and spun them into work clothes for women in the early 1970s, the city turned its back. That was until 1974, when US Vogue rhapsodized over the androgynous pieces and the label was thrust onto the international fashion stage.

EnSoie, Lindenhof Sister act

Colourful patterns are scant and logos non-existent in most of Zürich's covetable brands. Enter EnSoie, a family-run label that represents the stray red sock in the white wash.

It started as a silk trading company in 1894 and was taken over by Monique Meier in 1984. Her three daughters took the reins in 2013, spruced up the label and lowered the age of its customer base. This three-storey flagship displays a range of the brand's homeware, as well as cheery dresses, hand-knitted scarves and coats.

01 Waldraud, Gewerbeschule:

This shop on Josefstrasse sells clothing and accessories, most made sustainably in small numbers across the globe. Womenswear by Copenhagen's Stine Goya and minimalistic jewellery by AYM sit alongside Peter Jensen dresses, natural soaps by Hanahzo and Comme des Garçons T-shirts. waldraud.com

02 Kari Kari, Sihlfeld:

It's all about slow and ethical fashion at this petite corner shop – a short detour from nearby concept store Qwstion (see page 36) – run by Nina Gschwilm. Think carefully considered threads in enduring cuts from brands such as Lanius, Mara Hoffman and Christandl.
